ENROLLMENT FEE

The Festival enrollment fee for each Choir is 200 euros for the first category and 150 euros for every additional category, non refundable. The fee must be paid within 5 days after the application by bank transfer. After submission, we will send you our bank account details for payment.

FESTIVAL STRUCTURE AND PROGRAM

All groups participating in the Festival will perform in two stages:

1. Competition

2. Concerts

The Festival will include Live broadcasting from staff, organizers and performers from Florence, Italy.

- Meet the Jury, results announcement, presentation of specially recorded concerts. Masterclasses, Awarding Ceremony

- Grand Prix Competition for the finalists. A highly qualified International Jury will be announced shortly.

The videos must have been filmed live at concerts or rehearsals.

Videos must be recorded in 720p resolution or higher, in stereo.

The video files must be sent to our organization by WeTransfer (preferred) at: chairman@florencechoral.com or uploaded using Google Drive or Baidu Cloud.

Is allowed any kind of accompaniment, by piano, any type of instrument, orchestra.

IMPLEMENTATION PROCEDURES

Each choral group may subscribe to one or more categories, following a request for participation by completing an application form.

Each orchestra and choir will participate with one piece for category. The total performance time must be between 3 and 9 minutes

GRAND PRIX

The choirs and orchestras that achieve 80,01 points or higher, will be admitted at the Grand Prix Competition.

During the Grand Prix the participants will perform one piece of free chosen repertoire lasting between 3 and 9 minutes of music (choirs) and 5 to 15 minutes (orchestras). The piece must be different from the one performed in the categories.

The decisions of the Jury are final.

The Jury, after consideration of all artistic matters, may not award some prizes or may award joint or additional prizes.

RULES FOR EACH CATEGORY

CHOIRS

Categories A, B, C, D, E

- one work of the choir's own choice

Category F

- one work of Sacred Music of the choir's own choice

Category G

- one work of Popular, Folk, Gospel, Barbershop, Jazz and Modern of the choir's own choice

Category H

- one work of Early Music (1100-1700) of the choir's own choice

Category M

- one work of Modern and Contemporary Music of the choir's own choice

Category V

- one work of the choir's own choice

ORCHESTRAS

Categories A, B, C, D, E, F, H, L

- one work of orchestra's own choice

Category G

- one work of Folk, Jazz, Popular repertoire

Category I

- one work of Baroque repertoire

PRIZES

In each category the Jury will assign the following prizes:

1st place: Gold Medal, Diploma2nd place: Silver Medal, Diploma3rd place: Bronze Medal, Diploma

SPECIAL PRIZES

Grand Prix for the best Choir: 1.300 Euros, Trophy, Diploma

Grand Prix for the best Orchestra: 1.300 Euros, Trophy, Diploma

Best Choir Conductor: 300 euros, Trophy, Diploma

Best Orchestra Conductor: 300 euros, Trophy, Diploma

Best Performance of an Italian piece (Orchestras and Choirs): Trophy, Diploma

Best Male Soloist (Orchestras and Choirs): Trophy and Diploma

Best Female Soloist (Orchestras and Choirs): Trophy and Diploma

Best Performance of Italian Composer's Work (Orchestras and Choirs): Trophy and Diploma

Best Performance of Contemporary Composer's Work (Orchestras and Choirs): Trophy and Diploma

Best Choreography (Orchestras and Choirs): Trophy and Diploma

Best Traditional Costumes (Orchestras and Choirs): Trophy and Diploma

ADJUDICATING CRITERIA

Choirs will be judged according to the following criteria:

- Intonation
- Vocal Emission
- Interpretation
- Dynamics
- Repertoire
- Text Clarity and Articulation
- Overall Artistic Effect

Orchestras will be judged according to the following criteria:

- Intonation
- Quality of sound
- Insieme
- Interpretation
- Dynamics
- Repertoire
- Precision
- Overall Artistic Effect

According to the mark achieved, Bronze, Silver and Gold Diplomas will be awarded. If the choir does not achieve a Diploma (mark under 65,01) it will receive a certificate of participation. Each member of the Jury will write a report containing reviews and impressions about the performed repertoire of the choirs. The reports will be sent to the choirs by email.

The choirs that achieve 80,01 points or higher, will be admitted at the Grand Prix Competition.

The decisions of the Jury are final.

The Jury, after consideration of all artistic matters, may not award some prizes or may award joint or additional prizes.
